Special session held by city for two public hearings

▲ Chicken ordinance vote is December 9

Two public hearing were the reason the City of Clark called a special meeting for Thursday, November 18, at the Ullyot Building.

The first public hearing was for discussion regarding Ordinance #575, referred to as 'The Chicken Ordinance'.

The council, acting as the Planning Commission, recommended approval of this ordinance. The second reading, or final passage will occur Thursday, December 9, at the December City council meeting. This December meeting had been scheduled for the usual date, the first Monday of the month, Dec. 6, but was changed as the school Christmas concert is on that date.

Adam and Allison Imberi and son Gage were the lone 'Chicken Ordinance' proponents to attend the public hearing. No opponents were in attendance.

In a nutshell, the ordinance states: Harboring no more than eight chickens:

1. No person shall possess, own, house, harbor, care for, exercise control over, raise, confine, or keep any male chickens (rooster) or guinea hens within any Residential District in the City of Clark.

2. No person shall possess, own, house, harbor, care for, exercise control over, raise, confine, keep, or knowingly permit more than eight (8) hens within any Residential District in the City of Clark.

3. No person shall allow any chicken to run at large within the City of Clark.

4. Chickens are required to be housed in a coup approved by the board of adjustment.

5. The yard in which the coup is located shall be enclosed.

6. The property where a conditional use permit has been granted for housing, harboring, care for, raising, or keeping of chickens is

subject to warranted and unwarranted inspections.

The City of Clark approved the submission, by resolution, of an application for financial assistance in an amount not to exceed \$12,000,000 to the South Dakota Board of Water and Natural Resources for the project.

The applications are due by January, 2022 and the applications will be presented for funding in late March.

First Planning District representatives Greg Maag and Christine Crouse explained the funding application process along with Helms and Associate engineer Brandon Smid.

Maag explained that at this time around there are quite a few applicants, 200, which will amount to more than three billion dollars in application funding. There is not nearly that amount of funds available.

Maag explained that loans, grants and water rates are all interconnected and at this point the council is doing nothing more than putting in the application for fund-

When the funding decision is made next March, the city council will have the ability to accept or reject the funding.

The council will decide at that time, based on project affordability and how high the water rates will increase, as to whether or not to continue with a city-wide water project.

Before adjournment, the council transferred \$5,000 in funds for picnic tables and approved the 2020 city audit report.

The DOH currently reports total tests each day. There have been 1,681,312 total tests reported as of Monday, up 3,839 from 1,677,473 total tests reported on Friday. It was the 15th day in a row for active cases to increase.

The latest seven-day PCR test positivity rate for the state is 15.6% for Nov. 12-18. Of South Dakota's 66 counties, 65 are listed as having "high" or "substantial" community spread. "High" community spread is 100 cases or greater per 100,000 or a 10% or greater PCR test positivity rate.

"I think the East River rifle season opening weekend was pretty moderate and routine, which is good," said Clark County Game, Fish & Parks Conservation Officer Zach Thomsen.

"I saw many hunters this weekend," said Thomsen. "Some got their deer early, while others wanted to play the waiting game, Some really good deer were harvested this weekend."
