On the move: Clark-Willow Lake Cyclones 2023 - 2024 wrestling season preview

It won't be difficult for Clark-Willow Lake to find that chip on its shoulder for 2023-2024. After a successful 2022 campaign that netted five state qualifiers and a third place Northeast Conference finish, the Cyclones are ready to compete. Underestimate CWL at your own peril, as this year's roster is hungry for improvement at all levels.

Sure, the Cyclones are without Braeden Johnson and Chase Chambers due to graduation, but a new slate of wrestlers is working hard and ready to rumble. According to Head Coach Greg Marx, "It will be difficult to replace any senior whether it be in the practice room or on the mat, but I believe our team is set up nicely to advance through the season."

The bulk of the Cyclone's dual lineup returns for a program that Head Coach Greg Marx is convinced has worked its way into a better position than it found itself one year ago.

Finishing with a dual record of 11-6 and a sixth place standing at the Region 1B Tournament last February, the Cyclones return a strong nucleus from 2022, including State B place winners Cooper Pommer (4th) and Danielle Batchelor (5th) and qualifiers Austin Vig and Josh Kannegieter. Junior Elliot Bratland also returns as a veteran wrestler for the program. "I look for these kids to push the team towards a successful season," added Marx.

"My expectations this year are to have multiple state placers and to be in the running for a top three finish in our region as a team."

Marx has fortified his roster with both veterans and newcomers and the results may surprise some outsiders. Rookies in 2023 include seniors Collin Gaikowski and Bryce Klancke, sophomore Lincoln Reidburn and seventh graders Aksel Gjere, Bennett Pommer and Mason Severson. "Technically, Bryce has been around wrestling, but due to his injury last year, he couldn't compete," added Marx.

"I think overall this team knows what I expect of them and they have embraced the intensity that I want them to bring. We will encounter some speed bumps, but they are kids and we will push them to get better at every practice and match."
