
'Sounds of the Season', with "Do You Hear What I Hear", was the music program theme.

Shannon (Schlagel) Huber, Clark (Clark 2001) reads: "Clark had a runner-up and third-place finish in the Class A State Tournament as Huber scored 1,518 career points on teams that went 71-16. She was a four-year starter at South Dakota State University and she totaled 1,887 points at SDSU. Huber and the Jackrabbits won the NCAA Division II national title in 2003."

The Class of 2019 will be honored during the Hall of Fame induction banquet at 1:00 p.m. on March 23 at the Ramkota Hotel in Sioux Falls. The Watertown Arrows of 1959

will be recognized during the banquet as the Team of Excellence for 2019. Jim Marking coached the Arrows to the Class A state title and a 20-2 record.

### **December has been mild!**

Winter officially begins this Friday, Dec. 21. Meteorological winter began Dec. 1. Winter in northeast South Dakota in December has been almost non-existent in 2018 and no one is complaining.

In December 2018, the average temperature for the first 18 days of the month is 25°, a good 10° warmer than the average December to this point.

Twelve of the first 18 days of December this year, the high temperature for the day has been in the 30°'s or 40°'s. "Unheard of", say most long-time residents. Plus, the high temperature for the last eight days has been above freezing.

The high temperature this month was 49°, recorded this past Sunday, Dec. 16. The low temperature was found on Saturday, Dec. 8, it was 7°. Therefore, no -0 temperatures have

occurred this December.

December usually is a fairly wet month in northeastern South Dakota, having white Christmas' more often than not, but this December on four occasions, .01 amounts of precipitation were recorded and .02 once.

The mild December weather is newsworthy and will make the winter seem shorter, but Mother Nature has her way of evening things out.

The forecast through this week is above average with the temperatures but snow could make an appearance for Christmas Eve into Christmas day. A 40 percent chance of moisture exists for that time frame.
