# Calendar and capital outlay | Christmas services celebrate 'The Reason for the Season' plan discussed by school

▲ Clark School Board December meeting looks ahead to 2022

The December meeting of the Clark School Board of Education lasted 90 minutes, with the two major areas of discussion being 2022-23 school calendar and capital outlay, both for next year and the

five-year plan. Regarding the calendar for next year, it is very similar to this school term, but various 'tweaks' are being made. Three calendar options have been looked at by the board with superintendent Travis Ahrens making changes to bring back calendar #4 for the January meeting.

Discussion items for the calendar included: start date and week length of August week day session length; inservice dates; vacation lengths; built in snow days and fin-

Reviewing capital outlay expenditures for fiscal year 2022-23 was the longest discussion of the meeting. These capital outlay items and the costs include:

MS/HS Building: Student locker replacement (\$80,000). Replace building signage (east exterior wall). Update exterior door system (\$23,000 for both buildings). Fieldhouse A.C. install -ESSER (\$100,000). (ESSER funding is federal COVID-19 money. Clark School received over \$600,000 in ESSER funds to be used by 2024, with South Dakota Department of Education approval.)

Elementary Building: Elementary playground surface replacement and/or upgrades (Trust-Agency). Update exterior door system. Voss bathroom upgrade (\$15,000 ESS-ER). Boiler upgrade (\$260,000 ES-SER). EL Room update w/HVAC

Grounds: Install flag pole track/ FB complex (\$9,500). Agri-lime for shot put area (\$4-\$5,000). Lighting along north sidewalk at track (\$7,500-\$8,500).

Vehicles: 15-passenger (\$30,000).

Technology: \$50,000.

Curriculum: To be determined (ESSER 3).

Athletics: Boys basketball H/A jerseys, (\$5,000). Cheer. Weightroom upgrades (\$7,800).

The capital outlay levy for next year will be \$425,796. ESSER 3 funds projects will cost \$441,422; for a total of \$871,218.

The biggest price tag of the 2022-23 projects will be the elementary boiler with a \$260,000 price tag. A staff bathroom is also being looked at in the Voss wing of the elementary building.

As the talk turned past next year's capital outlay projects to the five-year capital outlay plan, board member Greg Marx talked about the wrestling room/garages/building trades expansion area, listed in the 2025-26 year plan.

"I think we should move this project to next year rather than four years from now," Marx said, and he gave a little history of this project and rationale why it should be on the short list rather than four years down the road.

With three wrestling club boosters in the audience, Marx spoke of how three years ago this project gained momentum, was on the fast track to becoming a reality and as it went through the channels of possi-
