The season of respiratory illnesses is in full swing


Coronavirus or COVID-19, Influenza and Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) are three of the most commonly spread upper respiratory illnesses this time of year and the Clark area is no exception.

"COVID is pretty much at a constant pace in the community as it has been for several months," Sanford Clinic - Clark's Physician's Assistant Louann Streff said. By now, we are no stranger to COVID-19, the symptoms and the protective measures that need to be taken to avoid infection.

High risk categories include those with chronic health conditions and people age 65 and over. For those high risk populations, once infected, Streff commented

that there is an oral medication called Paclovid that may help symptomatically.

Deb Waples, Director of Nursing at Avantara Clark, said, "There are currently no residents or staff af-

fected by COVID-19 or Influenza." While it is not mandated, vaccinations and boosters are available to all staff and residents at Avantara - Clark, which Waples believes to be an advocate to the health of the facility at this time.

According to the South Dakota Department of Health COVID-19 dashboard, in the last 30 to 60 days there were 36 reported cases of COVID-19 in Clark County, with 21 of those cases being reported in November.

Statewide reported cases at the beginning of the season averaged around 262,000, and in the last few weeks have had a steady rise up to around 303.000.
