Clark Day of Giving raises funds for local individuals in need

The sixth annual Clark Day of Giving was held last month by Clark Area Community Foundation and Clark Rotary Club.

Several fundraisers around the community generated funds for the Day of Giving. The Clark Lions Club pancake and burger feed raised \$2,000, the Clark Elementary School penny war raised \$1,600, and the Clark County Amazing Race committee donated \$1,600 after their event in October. The preschool class won the penny war at the school and were rewarded with an ice cream party.

A flyer was sent out in the *Clark* County Courier to help kick off the giving season. The food cart at Ken's Food Fair has been filled up six times and taken to ICAP to fill

up the Food Pantry, and the donation cart at Ken's will be going until January 1, 2025. "We don't want hungry families, so please take advantage of the food pantry if you need," encouraged Dala Albright.

Food donations have been starting to dispense into the Clark community, such as helping with turkeys and hams for the Thanksgiving and Christmas food boxes. Many more donations will soon be distributed.

"It was a great turn out again this year. We were able to raise \$31,000!" said Gayle Wookey.

Florence school board to revote on future of co-op with Henry

The November 11 decision by the Florence School Board to end its athletic co-op with Henry is on hold...for now.

The original decision last month was found to be invalid because there was no motion made by a board member calling for a vote.

Additionally, the vote was presented as a retention of the co-op, with those wishing to end it voting "No."

However, Robert's Rules of Order states that changes should be made in the affirmative. Essentially, a proper vote would have required a 'Yes" vote to end the co-op.

After an executive session lasting well over an hour, the second vote was tabled until next month. Board Member Cory Rislov moved to table the vote pending the results of a revised proposal sent to the Henry School Board.

The proposal is not publicly available, but it is thought to be an invitation from Florence to allow student athletes from Henry to participate in Florence athletics on a stand-alone basis.

The proposal was sent to Henry with a deadline of Friday, December 13. However, the item does not appear on the agenda of the next Henry School Board meeting scheduled for Wednesday, December 11.

Henry School Superintendent Todd Obele said it was more of gauge of interest, stating, "There will not be a vote, because there is nothing to vote on."

(Tuesday, December 31). These editions will also be available for counter sales on Tuesday.

For these editions (12/25/24 and 1/1/25), our holiday deadline will be before 5:00 p.m. the Friday prior to printing.

*Friday, December 27 will be the deadline for the December 31 edition.
