Twelve year-old and sixth grader at Willow Lake School, Aubrey Waldow and her family recently returned from Hawaii, where they spent a week together on behalf of the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

The Make-A-Wish Foundation is well known for making dreams come true for children who are

terminally ill or have a life threatening condition. Aubrey was diagnosed with Nager Syndrome. Andi, Aubrey's mother, stated that it is estimated that only 200 to 300 people have this diagnosis worldwide.

Nager Syndrome is characterized by a small lower jaw, which makes breathing difficult. Andi said

that most kids like Aubrey have a tracheostomy. Unfortunately, for those diagnosed with Nager Syndrome, not having a secure airway can be dangerous and potentially life threatening.

In December of 2019, a pulmonologist that was part of Aubrey's care team referred them to the Make-

A-Wish Foundation. As with many things, Covid-19 caused delays and an exceptionally long waiting time of almost four years before the family was finally given the wonderful opportunity to travel to Aubrey's
