

Clark High School senior Bryce Klancke was born in Minnesota and grew up in the small town of Arlington, about 60 miles west of Minneapolis. Bryce and his family moved to the Clark area in March of 2022 when he was 16. He is the son of Daniel Klancke and Georgia and Craig Buss. He has three sisters: Jasmine, Jaden and Jewel.

For his senior project, with help from his mentor, Tony Werdel of Tony's Collision Center and Justin Bowers of JB's Repair, he restored a 1993 Mercury Grand Marquis and put it up for auction to raise money for the Clark-Willow Lake Cyclones Wrestling Booster Club.

"I came up with the idea for my project by thinking of who I know," Klancke said. "Then came the idea of fixing up a vehicle; I work at Tony's Collision Center, and I would have the resources to do it," he explained.

Klancke got the car from a man that his mentor, Werdel, knows. "I fixed the intake hose and completed maintenance on

the car with the help of Justin Bowers," Klancke explained. "With Tony's help, I was able to cosmetically fix up the car and make it look newer." Klancke also replaced the windshield, headlights, wiper blades, mirror and spark plugs. Bids for the car were accepted

from March 5 until March 19. The highest bid for the car was \$1,700 from Collin Woodland, who is also a senior at Clark High School.

Upon graduation from Clark High School in May, Klancke's plans are to attend Mitchell Technical College in Mitchell, S.D., where he will be in the Power Line Construction and Maintenance program. After completing that one-year program at Mitchell Tech, he plans on doing an additional year at the school, joining the Electrical Utilities and Substation Technology program.

Six Clark area gymnasts competed at the South Dakota State Youth Gymnastics Meet as a part of the Dakota Gold Level 4 Gymnastics Club out of Watertown on March 22-24.
