Two municipal elections, one school board election and one school board opt out election will be held Tuesday, April 12.

At Henry School District 14-2, a \$300,000, 10-year tax levy opt out is up for election.

Also at Henry School, Nicole Watson and Mark O'Neill will be vying for a three-year term on the Henry School Board.

The Garden City voters will be choosing between Erica Benson and Norman Alexander for a two-year council position. David Waples is unopposed for a three-year Garden City council tern.

At Vienna, three individuals are running for one council position. The three running for office at Vienna are Elmer Anderson, Toby Kangas and Kenneth W. Lusk. School board filings

Clark and Willow Lake School districts will have school board elections in June, if necessary. Nominating petitions may be filed with the respective business managers from April 12 through May 13, 2016.

At Willow Lake, two three-year terms held currently by Julayne Thoreson and Cory Bratland are up for election.

### Clydesdales retire to Clark County farm

"I've always loved Clydesdales," says Nicki Fuller of Clark who along with her husband Dusty own five of them on their farm in Elrod Township.

"It was my mom's dream to own a Budweiser Clydesdale someday, so in a way I fulfilled that dream," smiled Fuller in regards to her mother, Chris Singrey's wish.

'Diamond' who is a Bay (dark brown) with white socks and a white blaze on his face met the requirements to be a 'Budweiser Clydesdale' and was a part of the San

Antonio, Texas 'Budweiser Hitch'. The Budweiser wagon or 'Hitch' is always pulled by eight horses who match the description of Diamond in their look.

Diamond and Dave - who also worked for Budweiser but has since been sold by the family, were purchased as a pair in February of 2015 by the Fullers.

They came from Grant's Farm in St. Louis, Mo.

"I wanted a safe, level headed driving team. I'd driven single horses up till then, but always wanted a nesota. She is a 15-year old female


Dave the Clydesdale had hip and back trouble however and was sold in November around the same time 'Cassidy' was purchased from Min-

driving team. A friend of mine got who now matches up with 15-year old Diamond and is similar in color.


"Clydesdales take about six years to come to adulthood," added Dusty Fuller. "They're a slow maturing horse, so a two-year old is still a baby in how they behave."
