

"This will be my first Mother's Day without my child," said Kimberly Paulson. Her daughter, Jessica Jones, was killed in a single vehicle car accident in Redfield last Sunday. Tren Bernard is Jessica's son and Kimberly's first grandchild. After school lets out for the year, he'll be staying in Clark with his grandparents.

"Jesi and I were always close, even when she was determined to go her own way," said Paulson. Jessica was only nine months old when her parents divorced and a year-and-ahalf when her mother moved them to Omaha. "It was just the two of us for a few years. We always knew we could count on each other."

Even when Jessica moved to Oklahoma on her own when she was a teenager, she would always call home to check-in. "One time while she was in Oklahoma, she called to tell me she found a bible verse in a notebook that she had taken from home." Paulson said that she was in the habit of writing down bible verses that struck on whatever piece of paper she had on hand. The bible verse Jessica found in the notebook was Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." This verse became very important to the pair. Whenever they came across it, they would share it with each other.
