Kay Mahlen, Clark County Treasurer will kick off her summer with retirement. Mahlen will exit the courthouse doors as treasurer for the last time at the end of this month. Carrie Reis will be the acting treasurer in her place for the

duration of her term. Thirty years ago, Mahlen was encouraged to take out a petition by a family friend and bowling buddy, Bob Bauman. While still apprehensive, Mahlen sought advice from her friend Linda who was a part time employee in the treasurer's office. Linda added to Bauman's encouragement, and Mahen petitioned for the position in 1993.

Prior to her employment as treasurer, the Clark County native lived and worked in California with her late husband, Jim Mahlen. After the couple married in 1968, they moved Roslyn, S.D. based company, The Strand Brothers.
