#### Driver in boating accident sentenced

Isaac Geiger, age 26, of Watertown, South Dakota, appeared before Circuit Judge Carmen Means in Clark on Monday, May 16th, for a change of plea and sentencing hearing in connection with charges related to a July 2021 boating accident occurring on Indian Springs, in Clark County.

According to Clark County State's Attorney Chad Fjelland, Geiger was charged with Reckless/ Negligent Operation of a Boat, and Overloading. The accident took the life of Christopher Kayl, of Worthing, South Dakota, and injured Chris Oltmanns, of Lennox, and Arthur Ceroll, of Sisseton.

#### Keyboard Korrector available June 1

Clark resident Tracy Nickels-Aguayo has patented a new invention - called the Keyboard Korrector. What is the Keyboard korrector? The name identifies its use.

"It elevates height to be placed under laptops, keyboards, notebooks, etc." said Nickels-Aguayo. "Any device you want to elevate to an ergonomically correct height."

She has had the idea 'messing around in her head' for some time. When she got a new desk at work she needed a device such as a Keyboard Korrector. Nickels-Aguayo is the Clark County Clerk of Courts.

"I was moving my keyboard quite frequently, scratching my desk. I thought I could correct this and that's what the Keyboard Korrector does," she said.


This invention has a rubber (composite) foot. It resists sliding, so it won't scratch the surface.

"What makes it handy is that it is very sturdy but at the same time mobile," Nickels-Aguayo said. "It velcros underneath your device. It pops off if you want to move it." She explained that if your laptop won't fit in your briefcase, you can just pop this device off.

Nickels-Aguayo signed with a Minnesota fabricator to produce the product. The patent is pending, and Keyboard Korrector will launch by June 1, 2022. She is meeting with a vendor this Thursday.

To get a patent to this point is quite an ordeal but at the same time quite an accomplishment.

"I'm proud and excited," ended Nickel-Aguayo.
