new Clark School business manager at the June meeting of the Clark School Board, Monday, at the high school library. It was a short meeting, lasting only 20 minutes.

Nelson replaces Heidi Sigdestad who earlier this year was hired as the assistant business manager in the Watertown school district. Nelson has been the business manager at Golden Living Center - Clark for the last 15 years.

This business manager transition process will take place this summer, with the Clark School budget hearing, slated for the regular meeting, at 6:15 p.m. on Tuesday, July 15 being a focal point of the transition.

Also approved at the June school board meeting were agreements/ contracts with Tim Page, P4 manufacturing teacher; Bobbi Uecker, teacher at Hillcrest Colony; and Chris Lee as junior high football coach. The rental agreement with Paul Streff/P4 Manufacturing was also approved.

During this process, high school principal Jerry Hartley spoke of the trials and tribulations of filling all of the certified staff contracts. Some fields are harder to fill than others, but this summer he stated that the lack of adequate housing

History comes to life during **Clark County Heritage Day**

The Crandall Church on the Clark County Historical Society Beauvais Museum complex was full, as many from the area came to hear Phyllis Schrag, Sioux Falls, talk about bygone eras.

Schrag, right, began her first program, 'Letters from the Attic', memoirs of her grandfather, in German script, with some audience participation. Simulating a father figure, Ralph Hurlbert, a mother figure, Faye Knutson and a brother figure, Kirk Severson, Schrag set the stage for the interpretation of letters back home to Illinois, 135 or so

Schrag discussed, in story telling form, the interpretation of these letters in German script addressed to her great-grandfather, F. J. Meier, by detailing pioneer life among those who settled in Dakota Territory between 1878 and 1889.

Her second program detailed all the fun and excitement of growing up in a small South Dakota community.
