## Capital outlay discussed by Clark School Board

A special meeting of the Clark are at \$2.00 or higher. School Board was called Monday night, specifically for the discussion of future building, capital outlay projects and strategic planning for the future.

In fear of being frozen at a mill levy of \$1.20 (per thousand \$ of valuation), by potential implements of South Dakota legislation, the board is seriously looking at the capital outlay fund, especially the \$460,200 amount for 2015-2016.

Superintendent Luanne Warren led the discussion on the two-year, 2015-2017 strategic planning goals for the Clark School District 12-2.

The superintendent had handouts of all the South Dakota school's respective capital outlay levies, with \$3.00 being the maximum that can be levied. Many schools, especially the larger schools, are maxed out at \$3.00. Clark, at \$1.20 is way to the low end. Schools with large land area and public utility projects, are in enviable positions. Most Northeast Conference schools

"Next summer we will be updating high school bathrooms, replacing ceiling tiles in the commons area and also replacing the high school dining tables," said Warren and the talk turned to heating and cooling for the future.

Johnson Controls handles the heating and cooling for both the el-
