Noteworthy, newsworthy Clark City August meeting

The August meeting of the Clark City Council lasted two hours and twenty minutes, due in part because it took a while to get through the 2020 preliminary budget plan-

City finance officer Jackie Luttrell led the discussion of the approximate \$2,000,000 proposed budget, that will receive the first reading in September and will be decided upon in ordinance form, in

Luttrell talked line item specifics as she went through both the revenue and expenditure sides, detailing any and all changes from the 2019 budget, noting the many variables that go into a city budget.

The budget discussion began with Luttrell explaining the parameters of the budget, cost of price increases (2.4%) and growth and then opined that the eight percent increase in sales tax was phenomenal over a

"Trying to ask for less money," stated Luttrell and as she stated that she wants to lower the city tax levy. That led to some discussion regarding the current county valuation process and how to keep taxes in line and still fund the various programs and costs in running a city the size of Clark.

The budget ordinance, after city passage, is always published in the Clark County Courier. As Luttrell

noted that she tried to decrease the tax levy request, in the neighborhood of \$25,000, board president Dennis Larson voiced that it is important not to go backwards. Newly appointed councilman Terry Schlagel asked many questions as the council went through the budget so 'he could be brought up to speed' on all the various line items.
