Pitcher Wes Jones threw a complete nine-inning game and held Alexandria to just three hits to set the tone for the Traders. Jones committed only one error and allowed the Angels one run to earn the win.

offensive spark that the Traders needed blasting a two-run homer over the left field fence to energize Clark. The Traders added one more run to close the inning with a 3-0

Tyson Gau plated Alexandria's only run in the fifth inning, but the Angels could not climb ahead stranding runners on base for most of the contest.

Bryce DesLauriers added one hit and one RBI for the Traders followed by David Novak and Jefferey Paulson with one hit apiece, and Brent Griffith with two hits and one
